Migration and Displacement – Concepts, Realities, Management

Thursday, October 28 through Thursday, November 04, 2021

To provide an opportunity to gain comprehensive, cutting-edge knowledge in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic, CPG's Academy on Migration and Displacement – Concepts, Realities, Management is going online. This academy addresses migration as complex and multifaceted phenomenon from a wide range of legal, political, anthropological, social, and economic perspectives and approaches, imparting a sense of the overwhelming, but underrated magnitude of change and challenge which comes along with the migration crisis.

Topics taught and discussed include

- causes and drivers of migration;
- impacts of migration on regional and national politics, societal developments and economy;
- migration governance (global, regional and national level);
- migration and development;
- integration of migrants in societies and labor markets;
- citizenship and integration;
- asylum and refugee protection; and
- conceptual challenges posed by migration for basic values under conditions of scarce resources.

The academy combines lecture, classes, and workshop components. Lectures are usually presented by an academic (the course leader or leaders) and are, in general, a listening and note-taking exercise. Classes present an opportunity to work through problem sets or case studies, present papers and discuss them, and to discuss the previous lecture with a class teacher and classmates.

Participants will have early access to pre-recorded lectures and readings which will be followed by live online seminars and discussions. The academy's engaging academic content will be complemented by a range of social opportunities for participants.
